IAEE Asia-Oceania 2020: Energy in Transition Call for Abstracts

The International Association for Energy Economics and the Energy Centre, University of Auckland invite you to participate in the 7th International Association for Energy Economics (IAEE) Asia-Oceania conference in Auckland, 12-15 February 2020.

New Zealand is emerging as a global leader in renewables and smart energy. We have a large number of renewable energy sources available - geothermal, hydroelectricity and wind. Investment in these technologies has positioned us well to shift our energy reliance toward more sustainable resources.

1. Theme

The conference theme is to understand and evaluate the implications of the emerging energy transition for energy markets and consider and debate policies to facilitate the transition. The conference program will address critical issues of vital concern and importance to governments and industries, and provide a forum where policy issues are presented, considered and discussed at both formal sessions and informal social functions.

Theme: Energy in Transition

Conference Topics:

1. Asian Energy in transition by 2040: national strategies, forecasting transition, long term energy scenarios, country studies
2. Fossil Fuels: green shift in China, innovative technology, infrastructure investment, supply and demand forecasts, trade
3. Smart Cities: disruptive technology, utility challenge, new business models, demand side management, storage, renewable integration, ancillary services
4. Efficient Energy: macroeconomic, industrial innovation, structural change, sector and economy level trends
5. Electricity Markets: market structure, performance, reforms, market design, integration of renewables, capacity markets
6. Energy Transitions in Transport: electrification, autonomous vehicles, market share, hydrogen, road pricing,
7. Low-carbon economy: climate change, policy, carbon pricing, market design
8. Policies and regulations to achieve energy transition: economy level studies, foreign direct investment, institutional change, regional market interconnection

All submissions should be in reference to work currently underway or completed within the last year.

We welcome abstracts presenting research using a wide diversity of methods:

- Economic studies (e.g. econometric, optimisation)
- Field and lab experiments
- Surveys, conjoint analysis
- Techno-economic bottom-up models
- General equilibrium, macro models
- Game-theoretical methods
- Simulations (e.g., agent based models)
- Interdisciplinary research (e.g., law and economics, political economy)
- Business cases / case studies / benchmarking

2. Presentation Guidelines

Abstracts for oral and poster presentations must be no more than two pages in length and must include an overview of the topic including its background and potential significance, methodology, results, conclusions and references. All abstracts **must** conform to the format structure outlined in the template.

Oral Presentations

Presentations should aim to engage the audience, to create interest, seek feedback and encourage further enquiry. Presentations are approx. 15 minute long conversation starters, followed by 5 minutes for further discussion, for a total of *20 minutes. Presentations must reference work currently underway or completed within the last year. A full paper is not required for submission.

Posters

Posters encourage direct engagement between those with interesting work to share and a wide audience, in a personal setting. Posters will be mounted in the open space available to attendees during breaks.

3. Presenter Attendance

At least one author of an accepted paper or poster must pay the registration fees and attend the conference to present the paper or poster.

Authors will be notified by 18 October 2019 of the status of their presentation or poster.

Authors whose abstracts are accepted will have until 28 November 2019 to register to the conference and submit their final papers or posters for publication in the online conference proceedings.

While multiple submissions by individuals or groups of authors are welcome, the abstract selection process will seek to ensure as broad participation as possible. Each author may present only one paper or one poster in the conference. No author should submit more than one abstract as its single author.

If multiple submissions are accepted, then a different author will be required to pay the registration fee and present each paper or poster. Otherwise, authors will be contacted and asked to drop one or more paper(s) or poster(s) for presentation.

Those interested in organizing a concurrent session should propose a topic and four possible speakers to iaee2020@auckland.ac.nz

4. Evaluation Criteria

All submissions will be reviewed based on the following criteria:

- relevance to the themes and aims of IAEE Asia-Oceania 2020
- originality and degree of engagement to IAEE Asia-Oceania 2020
- relevance and applicability to the audience
- compliance with the word count and format requirements for abstracts (as per template)

All submitting authors will receive an email confirming the outcome of their proposal. All of these criteria are key considerations in the acceptance of all submissions. We reserve the right to discuss your submission with you as part of the process of assembling the program, and may accept your proposal under a different category, for example accepting a presentation as a poster.
